Candlemas Day - Saturday 2nd February



Candlemas Day is also celebrated as the Presentation of Christ in the Temple and marks the presentation of Jesus to God in the Temple. Luke's gospel records that Simeon the Priest, together with Anna, a prophet, met Jesus in the Temple in Jerusalem. Simeon held the baby Jesus and declared him to be a light for revelation to the Gentiles and for glory to the people of Israel. On Candlemas night, many people place lighted candles in their windows at home.

Many Christian festivals have pagan origins and in ancient times Candlemas was the festival of light, marking the mid-point of winter, between the winter solstice and spring equinox. Candles were lit to scare away evil spirits on dark winter days and nights.

People also believed that Candlemas Day predicted the weather for the rest of the winter, rather like St Swithin's Day.

If Candlemas Day be fair and bright Winter will have another fight. If Candlemas brings cloud and rain Winter won't come again.
